Today at 11 o'clock we all gathered in the playground to mark remembrance day. All the staff and children honoured a two minute silence as a mark of respect for those who fought in The First World War and other conflicts since then around the world. During the week our assemblies focused on this subject and also spread, as did the silence, a message for future peace and hope in the world.

HALF TERM

Next week is national Anti-Bullying Week and the school will be showing recognition of this. Our assemblies will be focusing on this theme as will our PHSE lessons. Our Key Stage 2 children will also be visited by Anti-Bullying Ambassadors from Brighton Hill Community School next Friday.

We pride ourselves in being a reasonably diverse community and celebrate this through our school ethos of showing respect and tolerance towards each other and teach our children these essential values. We give support to children who feel victimised but also give support to those who are causing the problem, so that they learn from their mistakes and do not repeat unwelcome behaviour.
