On Friday 27th April our Oak Class Tag Rugby squad took part in the annual Sparkling Rugby Festival at Overton Rugby Club. Once again we fielded two teams, the Cliddesen Cats and the Cliddesden Sharks.

The Cats started well winning their first three games convincingly. The next was against group favourites Longparish. It was a tightly fought match but we were narrowly beaten 2-3. With

Longparish unbeaten and clearly finishing top of the group it was all to play for in our final game against Silchester, who had also only lost one game.

This was a very close game with Silchester and Cliddesden scoring try after try. It ended with a superb equaliser from Guy to finish 4-a-piece. We then had to wait to see if we qualified as best second place team. It couldn't have been closer with The Cats and Silchester finishing on equal points, but unfortunately overall, Silchester scored one more try than us in the group games and so it was



Silchester that qualified. Hearts sank but we were soon uplifted when squad captains Hope and Finlay were presented with the trophy for winning the local schools Norman League this year.

The Norman League consisted of teams from Cliddesden, Hatch Warren, St John's and Rucstall. We won the league convincingly beating Hatch Warren 10-3 in our final game. St John's had previously won the trophy 5 years in a row so it was a good feeling to be champions!

The Sharks team was made up of less experienced team members led by the more experienced captain Alex. They battled hard and although lost more games than they won, they showed excellent team spirit, determination and hope for the future!



The previous day we also fielded a mixed team of year 3 and 4 children in the lower key stage 2 tournament. They were a newly formed team, some of whom have not played in a tournament before. They started a little shakily, but soon found their stride, improving with each game. They played fairly and as a team throughout the day and their behaviour was exemplary. They all found new skills and learnt a lot from the experience. We were very proud of all their efforts.
