In 2018, with your help, we have fed over 4,000 people of whom just over 1,350 were children. So far this year we have fed just over 2,900 people.

We are currently distributing an average of 3.3 tonnes of food per month to people in crisis in the Basingstoke and Deane region.

Yesterday I had the pleasure of joining Chestnut Class on their educational visit to Butser Ancient Farm. As an enrichment activity to support their history study on Stone, Bronze and Iron Age, the children learned first-hand what is was like to live in these ancient times. They saw replica buildings from this period and learned the skills of how to wattle a fence, make clay pots, use raffia for cording and also enjoyed an archaeological dig. The staff at

the farm commented on how well our children listened and behaved. Well done Chestnut Class.
