Dear parents, carers and members of our school community

CV19 Update

I would like to say how wonderful pupils have been in adapting to our "new normal" and we are enormously proud of how they - along with adults in school and you as parents - are managing these difficult times. There is a strong sense of community and team spirit in school as ever.

As you will have read in the news, there are many people currently struggling to get a Covid test for their children. Despite this, it is important that if your child is displaying Covid symptoms that you must try and get a test and isolate until tested. We have had some children off with colds and as I said earlier in the week, if your child has a cold please keep them off until they are better and if they display any of the 3 main Covid symptoms, book a test and follow the isolation procedures. Our ultimate aim during this year is to keep the school open. If there is an outbreak of Covid in the school, it will not be my decision to close a class bubble or the school but Public Health England. Let us hope that never happens.

We need the continued support and diligence of the Cliddesden school community and we thank you for following the processes we have put in place.

For the school to remain open we need staff, and in particular, teachers not to become ill. So, if a teacher has suspected Covid symptoms they will need to self-isolate and access a test. If the test is negative they can come back to school. However, it may be the case that there will **not** be another member of staff to take the class without entering a new 'bubble' or there might be a delay in accessing a test.

The school is currently in the process of setting up a plan for remote learning should children need to isolate at any point or if a bubble has to stay off school. To assist us in this, could you please let the school office know by email if your child would not be able to access an electronic device during a period of absence from school. We have spent a lot of time preparing our Covid mitigation approaches, re-reading the guidance and thinking through different scenarios and our response to those scenarios. We have continued to have meetings to answer staff questions and clarify our thinking regarding how to keep the school functioning under the 'new normal'. I have spent time talking to other Headteachers locally, meeting with my Chair of Governors and keeping up with accounts from other schools which has been incredibly useful.

We have updated our CV19 risk assessment and this is available to view in Statutory Information on our school website.

A reminder of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- a <u>high temperature</u> this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, <u>continuous cough</u> this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.
