Important Update Covid -19 Risk Assessment

We have updated our Covid-19 risk assessment again this week so please read the following message carefully.

Whilst Basingstoke and Hampshire remain medium risk areas, cases of Covid-19 are increasing locally on a daily basis and hospital admissions are rising too. The safety of our whole school community; children, teachers, staff and parents will always be the school's priority.

Therefore, from **Monday 19**th **October 2020** we would like to insist that all parents wear a face covering when coming onto the school playground to pick up children. This will apply in the main to parents of children in Willow and Beech classes. It is important that the parents of the younger children <u>do</u> come onto the playground at pick-up so we can ensure we hand your children over safely. Please do not wait outside the gate as it causes congestion and makes social distancing difficult.

For Oak and Chestnut parents, the system will remain the same. You may wait by the fence but you must socially distance from each other, and although outside the school gates and car park I cannot insist on you wearing a face mask, it is something you may well wish to consider.

Staff, will not be wearing face masks unless they choose to, as it is not in our risk assessment to do so under the DfE guidance. They will continue to adhere to our social distancing rules. We also ask that when you are wearing a face mask, you also practice social distancing, even with other parents who are in your friendship bubble. Whilst the children in school are in 'bubbles', there is no such thing as a parent bubble in school.
