Dear Parents and members of the school community

The stress and anxiety that we have all endured over the last couple of years does not seem to be going away yet. Just as we seem to be winning the battle against Covid, another unfortunate world event is taking place. Many of the children, particularly our older ones, are aware of the conflict in Ukraine and as ever we have been treating this sensitively with our children. This week Reverend David came to school for his assembly and led a prayer for those involved in the conflict. If your child is worried or upset the key thing is to reassure them. Below is a quote and advice from Prof Vivian Hill, from the British Psychological Society, if your children ask you about the subject. Also, CBBC Newsround is a suitable way of communicating world news to children.

"Keep it as matter-of-fact as you can: explain that there have been wars all over the world in the past few years and we've been lucky that most of them haven't had any impact on families in the UK - it's a good way of helping them to have a sense of the degree of risk that's posed to them, and that's what children want reassurance about - that they're safe."

I met with The Pupil Parliament this week and they were very keen to ask the school community to help support refugees from Ukraine. We decided that next week the school would do a collection for the Disasters Emergency Committee (www.dec.org.uk) which is a group of charities, including the British Red Cross and Save the Children, working together to support this cause. Year 5 Pupil Parliament representative, Sofia says

"Although I was born in the UK, I am from a Ukrainian family. I want to help the people who have had to leave their country because of the war. I hope you will help us, help them."

If you would like to make a cash donation please put it in an envelop marked DEC and ask your child to hand it in to their teacher by Friday 11^{th} March. Once we have collected the donations we will send the money to the charity. Thank you.



World Book Day

Yesterday we celebrated World Book Day in school. The children and staff came dressed as book characters and there were some super and inventive costumes. During the day the children took part in a range of book related activities and we had a whole school assembly where we talked about the importance and enjoyment of reading. At Cliddesden Primary School we have ensured that in all our classrooms there is a range of books, both fiction and non-fiction, that enrich our children's' understanding of diversity. This may be by subject or author. One of our favourites is 'The boy at the back of the class' by Onjali Rauf. It is about a boy who comes to London as a refugee and problems he faces making new friends, adapting to a new life and facing racial prejudice. It has helped us learn the difficult journeys that refugees undertake for education and safety.
